Internet Resources

- Use online indexing systems ("search engines") such as Bing, Google, or Yahoo.

- Check your career center's website for links related to career planning and job hunting (e.g., www.career.fsu.edu/library/links.cfm).
- Look in publications or directories of specialty Internet sites.
- Ask professionals in your career area for the electronic addresses of helpful sites.

- Research potential employers & organizations.
- Identify position openings by occupation & state.
- Post your resume and apply online on various networks.



A CIP Perspective

Self-Knowledge

 Extremely important in developing various forms of written communication in the job-search process

Options Knowledge

 Knowing "what's out there," and that involves learning about the various environments where you might find employment and being able to effectively manage all the information available through the Internet

Decision Making

 Targeting employers and implementing a plan to reach them using various communication methods requires you to give attention to each aspect of the CASVE Cycle

Executive Processing

 Be aware of the tendency to become overwhelmed or frustrated when using the Internet in your job search
