


Graduating Seniors

The Division of Student Affairs has administered a survey to graduating seniors for over a decade, asking students about their post-college plans and their overall FSU experience. Beginning in fall 2012 in collaboration with Academic Affairs, the survey was added as a graduation requirement, and **over 95% of graduating seniors** from fall 2012 and spring 2013 completed the survey.

Employment

Data indicate that over half of FSU graduates seeking employment have at least one job offer by graduation and are offered employment in a wide variety of industries.






Finding Employment

How Seniors Found Employment Opportunities






Education


