end of your transcript. Your Cum GPA is used for your academic standing (good/probation/dismissal) at FSU. You can find your official FSU GPA by logging into the [myFSU Portal](#), clicking the Student Central (SC) icon, and accessing your unofficial transcript under the Academic Records menu.

research, constituent representation, and advocacy initiatives. Through these roles, she has developed strong skills in legislative analysis, policy research, written communications, and stakeholder engagement.

All applicants must submit a one-page resume as part of their FSU DC Study Away Program application. While the Selection Committee takes many things into account when making program admissions decisions, your one-page resume should exemplify your ability to be concise and communicate effectively. It is also an opportunity for you to showcase your greatest accomplishments, further build your case as to why you are a great candidate for the FSU DC Study Away Program and showcase that your one-page resume is ready for the competitive Washington, DC internship market

- DC internship applications require applicants to submit a well-written, personalized cover letter that answers several provided, relevant prompts. For your FSU DC Study Away Program application, upload a cover letter that specifically responds to the following prompts:
 - *Why do you want to participate in the FSU DC Study Away Program?*
 - *How would participating in an internship in Washington, D.C. specifically contribute to achieving your professional goals?*
 - *Living and working in Washington, D.C., requires initiative, adaptability, professionalism, and resilience. Describe a time when you stepped outside your comfort zone to pursue a meaningful opportunity or overcome a challenge.*
- Pro tips:

Please upload your writing sample.

- Most DC internship applications *require* applicants to submit a writing sample. For your FSU DC Study Away Program application, upload a writing sample that isn't too long, is well-written, and demonstrates your ability to make an argument.
- Pro tips:
 - A writing sample is a short supplemental document requested by employers to evaluate your communication skills, thought process, and grammar. It demonstrates your ability to analyze information, organize your thoughts, and present a clear, professional argument.
 - Because the D.C. internship market is a highly competitive, fast-paced hub for public policy, law, and media, employers rely on these writing samples to verify that you can conduct rigorous research, analyze complex data, and communicate concisely under tight deadlines.
 - How should you choose a writing sample? If you have to choose between a highly relevant but poorly written paper and an impeccable but slightly less relevant piece, always choose the one that showcases your best writing.
 - If your best academic paper or legal memo is 15 pages long, only submit an excerpt. Add a brief note at the top specifying that it is an excerpt from a longer paper and include your original prompt.

Please provide contact information for two professional or academic references.

- Most DC internship applications require that applicants provide contact information for 2-3 **professional or academic** references. Ideal references include former internship supervisors, managers, close professors or faculty/staff advisors. List 2 professional or academic references you would utilize in the DC internship application process.
- Pro tips:
 - Provide at least one academic reference (e.g. a professor who knows your skills) and one professional reference (e.g. a past supervisor, manager or student organization advisor, etc.).
 - Never use relatives or personal friends as professional or academic references.
