Welcome to Career Advisor Scholarship (CAS) News. According to my unofficial records, the value of our endowed scholarship funds in October 2020 was \$586,750, or \$15,125 less than a year ago. We awarded \$24,191 (\$1,748 more than 2019) in scholarships this year. In the past 25 years, we have awarded

\$280,030 in 174 scholarships to 124 different students. We now have 232 contributors making 694 gifts.

Special thanks to 9 alumni fellows contributing this year. Your nameplate is on the wall plaque. Remember, only 4% of the interest earned annually from a gift is made available for scholarships and the remainder contributes to future awards.

COVID-19 Update. Our Career Center has been locked and closed for in-person services since March and is now working remotely. I have not been able to acknowledge your gifts as in the past.
