



Graduating Seniors

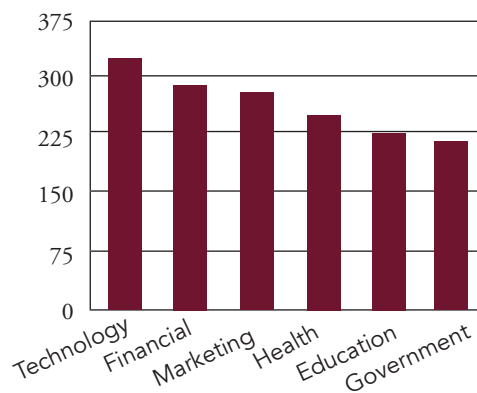
The Career Center, in conjunction with the Office of Institutional Research, has administered a survey to graduating seniors since 2003, asking students about their post-college plans and overall FSU experience. Beginning in fall 2012 in collaboration with Academic Affairs, the survey was added as a graduation requirement. **Over 92% of graduating seniors** from summer 2018, fall 2018, and spring 2019 completed the survey. Also included in these findings are the results of a six-month follow-up survey.

Employment

Data indicate that more than two-thirds of FSU graduates seeking employment have at least one job offer within six months following graduation and are offered employment in a wide variety of industries.

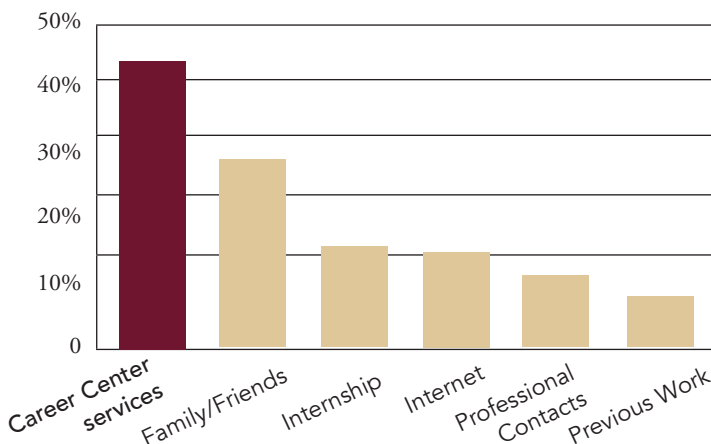
Top Employment Industries



Finding Employment

Graduates relied on a number of resources to find their jobs. Data indicate that over one-third of graduates used one or more resources from The Career Center in securing their position. For the **seventh year in a row**, graduates indicated that the number one way they found career opportunities was through Career Center services.

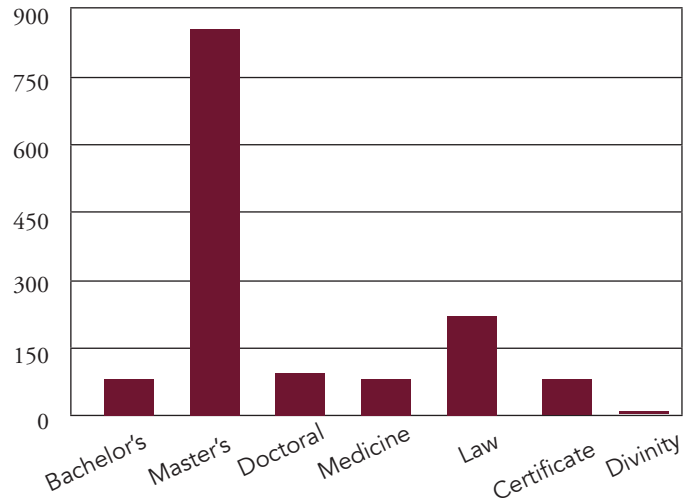
92.2% of graduates participated in on-campus activities, including on-campus employment

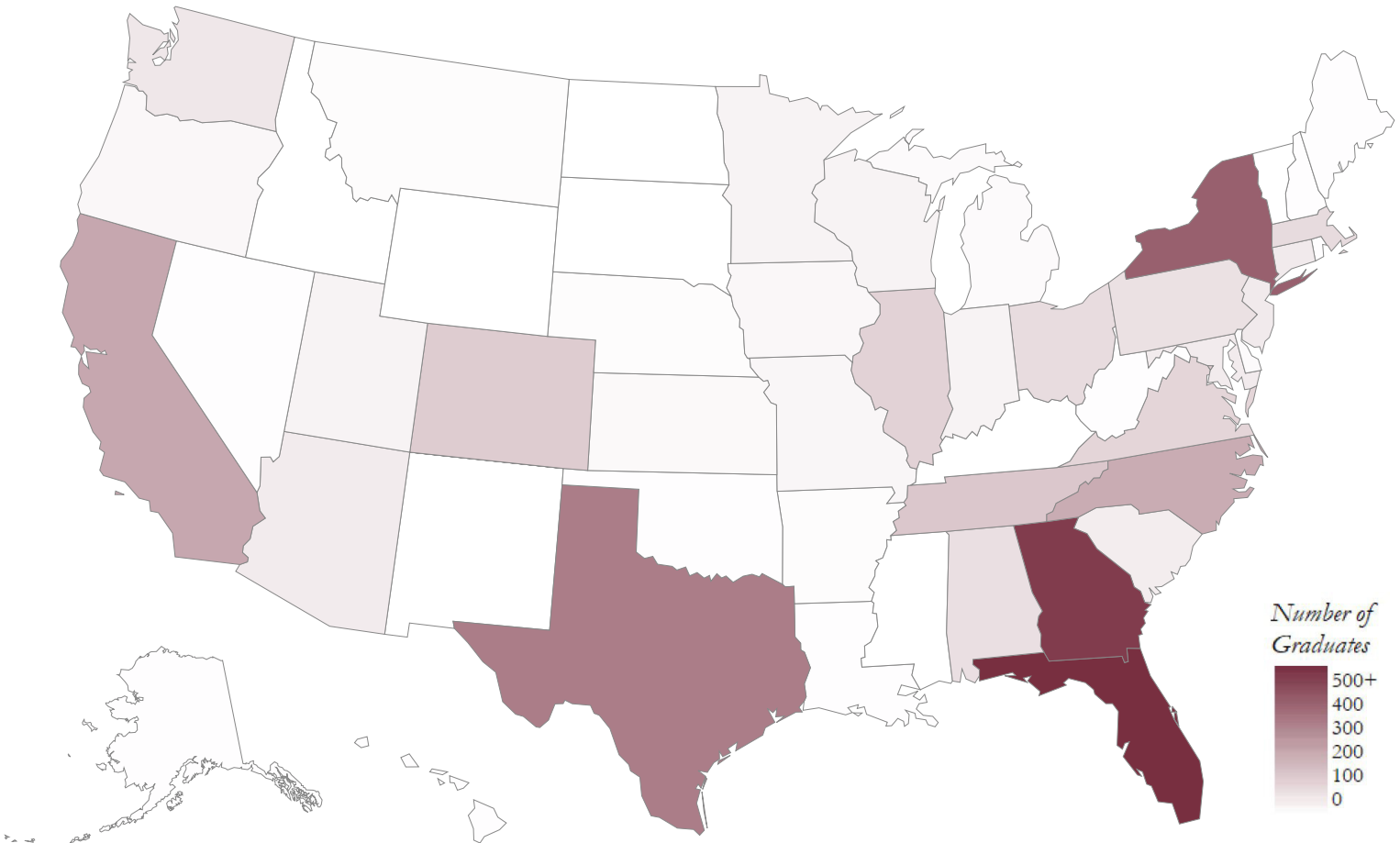
Degrees Pursuing
