
GRADUATING SENIORS

The Career Center, in conjunction with the Office of Institutional Research, has administered a survey to graduating seniors since 2003, asking students about their post-college plans and overall FSU experience. Beginning in fall 2012 in collaboration with Academic Affairs, the survey was added as a graduation requirement. Information about post-graduate plans was collected from **over 96% of graduating seniors** from summer 2022, fall 2022, and spring 2023. This includes a 94% response rate on an initial survey, a three-month follow-up survey, and additional knowledge collected via strategic LinkedIn searches and the National Student Clearinghouse.

Employment

Data indicate that more than three-fourths of FSU graduates seeking employment have at least one job offer within three months following graduation and are offered employment in a wide variety of industries.



Finding Employment

Graduates relied on a number of resources to find their jobs. Data indicate that nearly one-third of graduates used one or more resources from The Career Center in securing their position. For the **eleventh year in a row**, graduates indicated that the number one way they found career opportunities was through Career Center programs and services.








A Vast Alumni Network
