AMBASSADOR POSITION DESCRIPTION

The Career Center Student Ambassador Program is recruiting students for the 2018-2019 school year! As an Ambassador you will get the opportunity to represent The Career Center and develop valuable skills to help you personally and professionally.

REQUIREMENTS

- Commit to program for at least 2 semesters (Fall 2018 & Spring 2019)
- Minimum 2.75 GPA AND be in good academic standing with FSU
- Volunteer a minimum of <u>25 hours per semester</u>
- Attend ALL bi-weekly Professional Development Sessions on Wednesdays from 9:05-9:55 AM
- Attend our MANDATORY training session on <u>Friday</u>, <u>August 24</u>, <u>2018</u>

AMBASSADOR ROLES & RESPONSIBILITIES

- Market and promote Career Center events and services to students
- Volunteer at programs and events such as career fairs and workshops
- Conduct presentations and outreach to market Career Center services and events to students
- Host employer visits including information sessions and interview days

BENEFITS

- Significant leadership experience
- Enhance your resume and boost your professional presence
- Network with students, employers and staff
- Opportunity to make an impact on students' college experience

DESIRED QUALITIES

- Possess strong interpersonal skills, have a positive attitude and willingness to serve

- Ability to manage multiple tasks (academics, ambassador requirements and other responsibilities)

SELECTION PROCESS OVERVIEW

Step 1: LEARN ABOUT THE POSITION

Students should review the application and position information on our website **AND** attend an information session. This information will help you have a better understanding of what the job entails. Be sure to also confirm that you are available for all listed dates and will be able to attend all mandatory events.

Step 2: COMPLETE ONLINE APPLICATION

Students must submit an application and resume through **Handshake** in order to be considered for the program. All parts of the application must be submitted by **FRIDAY**, **MARCH 23RD**. **Hard copy applications will not be accepted**

Short Essay Questions: You will be asked to answer two (2) questions:

- Why are you interested in becoming a Career Center Ambassador and what can you contribute to the team?
- What you do hope to gain from being a Career Center Ambassador?

References: You will be asked to provide two (2) professional or academic references

Step 3: INTERVIEW SELECTIONS

After applications have been reviewed, students selected for interviews will be contacted via email. Selected students will sign-up for interviews in Handshake

Step 4: INTERVIEW ROUND

There will be a 30-minute interview with a panel of Ambassador Program staff. Interviews will take place in The Career Center (Dunlap Success Center).

Step 5: SELECTION OF AMBASSADORS

The Ambassador Program staff will notify students on the decisions the week following interviews. Selected students will attend a Welcome Reception the Friday before Finals Week.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Are Information Sessions Mandatory, and what is covered?

Yes. Each student is required to attend an Information Session in order for their application to be considered. Each Information Session will cover the Ambassador position, the application process and the expectations of the role. In order to get credit for session attendance, make sure you swipe/sign-in at the Information Session.

Do I have to be a specific major or year level?

No. Any student can apply for the Ambassador position.

Do I have to be involved on campus to apply to be an Ambassador?

No. However, the application will require to you to answer a few questions regarding: previous/current employment, campus or community involvement and any leadership positions you may have held

I graduate next year. Can I still apply?

In order to be eligible for the Ambassador Program, you must be an FSU student through Spring 2019.

Do I need reference letters?

No. You do not need recommendation letters, but you will need to list two (2) references on your application. This reference should not be a peer or a close friend/family member.

What types of characteristics or abilities are you looking for in an Ambassador?

We are seeking students who have a willingness to learn and grow as a student, person, and leader. Additionally, students should be committed service, have excellent communication and time management skills, ability to work well in a team and professionalism.

What if I have to miss a session or training?

When you apply, you are committing to all the required dates. Please tell Ambassador staff before accepting the role if you are aware of an obligation that will require you missing a session. If we are unable to work through the conflict with you, we suggest you consider applying for the program in the future.

Can I have another job?

In the past, Ambassadors have had jobs, internships or been involved in other activities. We expect the Ambassador position to be a priority and students should have excellent time management skills.

What's a typical work week like for an Ambassador?

The Ambassador Program is designed to allow for flexibility in a student's schedule. Volunteer opportunities are presented throughout the semester and slots are broken down into 1-hour increment time periods. Career Fair week is our busy week and we look for Ambassadors to volunteer at least 1 day throughout that week.

Will I have to learn about everything The Career Center offers by myself?

No. Ambassadors go through a full-day training session, that will teach you the most critical aspects of The Career Center. Throughout your time volunteering, you will be surrounded by fellow Ambassadors and/or Career Center staff to help you gain the knowledge you will need to be successful.
